Jonathan,

I hope you are doing well and staying productive.

We have a request for you related to GTO time. The TNO GTO program is a

collaboration between a few different time-holders and there have been some time transfers in the past between these programs. These have exclusively been from Heidi Hammel's program to the other time-holders and we were recently notified that Heidi's program is oversubscribed by 0.7 hours. While this is not a lot, we have been requested to fit it back in the box.

I see that back in 2018, Heidi transferred 0.5 hours to your program and I am wondering if you would be willing to transfer 0.4 or 0.5 hours of that back to Heidi to help make up the deficit. This will be combined with a slight rework of another program that does not result in loss of science to make up the 0.7 hours.

If you are not comfortable doing this because you would like to save your remaining time for Cycle 2 work, or for any other reason, please let me know and we will work to make up the savings in the TNO program elsewhere.
