- Formally announced, Roger Davies & Antonella Nota co-chairing.
- Sponsored by ESA, in collaboration with NASA, STScI.
- Designed to highlight the scientific breakthroughs made by the Hubble Space Telescope during its two decades of operation.
- Three specific goals:
 - to share the latest results from Hubble across the broad canvas of astronomy,
 - to inspire the community of Hubble users to think how Hubble's successor — the James Webb Space Telescope — will move their scientific field forward,
 - to look yet further into the future, posing the scientific questions that will shape the field of astrophysics in the next decade.
